Be a Counselor!



Pilgrim Lodge could not function without its volunteer counselors. You don't need to have all the answers, just be willing to spend time with children and teenagers. Please help our vital ministry with the gift of your time. Most counselors come back year after year because a week at Pilgrim Lodge is such a rich and rewarding experience for everyone involved. You must be at least 18 years old and two years older than the oldest camper. Those between 16 and 18 years may serve as a counselor in training (CIT) for camps with younger participants (see page 11). Take a look at which sessions you are most interested in, and then call (724-3200) or E-mail Karen (karen@pilgrimlodge.org) You will be teamed up with a dean who will send you background check forms and ask you for recommendations (including your pastor). You will be asked to attend meetings prior to your session to get to know your fellow counselors, learn about the program, and receive basic counselor training. As a thank you, we will reduce the camper fee for one immediate family member by \$75.

Meals Served: Saturday Breakfast for those staying over Friday, Lunch Saturday for everyone. An important and fun PL work weekend, Jump Start is an opportunity to serve as we open the camp and polish up for the new season. We need people of all abilities. Basic gardening, yard work and cleaning are just the beginning. We also have projects needing light carpentry, roofing, chain sawing, and wood splitting and stacking. The Pilgrim Lodge Labyrinth

Nestled in the woods, just past Edna's point and not far from the lake, you will find the Pilgrim Lodge Labyrinth. It is an 8-course labyrinth on a cruciform pattern, meaning there are four quarters as in Chartres cathedral (which is a 900 year-old 11-course labyrinth). The paths are almost four feet wide, so there is room for people to pass. The field stones that mark the way are taken from the cabin chimneys that had to be torn down. The labyrinth is 84 feet in diameter. As you enter the labyrinth, and again as you enter the center, you are facing east. We consider it an extension of the PL chapel and trust it will be treated as sacred space. We are excited to make use of the labyrinth this summer. Parents of campers can visit the labyrinth during registration. All others should call the Pilgrim Lodge office before visiting to walk the labyrinth.

On Labor Day weekend we pause, as we are 'On the Way' from summer to fall, from one school year to the next: a time of transition and preparation. Join us at Family Camp for a long weekend to relax, worship and play, unplugged, with your own family and others of all descriptions from around the state. A seven year old says "I can pray and have fun and play with best friends I hardly ever see!" A twelve year old says "a family can spend the whole weekend together; no work, no school, just enjoy yourself and God in the outdoors!" There will be worship, water play, meals, walking the labyrinth, singing--and even relaxation in your own lakeside cabin. You may just start a family tradition. Space is limited, so please reserve early!



Important Information That parents must read before signing the registration form

Payment & Refunds: A non-refundable deposit of \$75 (or other amount if indicated) is required with the initial registration. The balance is due at the conference office two weeks before the start of the event. We no longer accept payment at camp. If payment is not received on time, campers may forfeit their spot to others on the waiting list. Campers with open invoices from previous years will not be allowed to register until such invoices are paid. If a camper withdraws more than one week before the start of a session, the deposit will be forfeited, but any additional payments that have been made will be refunded. If a camper withdraws one week or less before the start of a session, the parent (or adult camper) will be responsible for the full camp fee; no refunds will be made. There is no refund for campers sent home for illness, homesickness, injury or discipline.

Potential Tax on Camp Registrations: The Maine State legislature is considering taxing portions of camp such as food service. In the event that such a law is passed, parents (or adult campers) will be notified and responsible to pay such taxes in addition to their camp fee.

Behavior: Certain behaviors which are deemed inappropriate, may result in a camper being sent home and the camper's minister being notified. These behaviors include, but are not limited to, fighting; hitting; biting; stealing; destruction of, or intrusion into, another's property; threatening another; defying a counselor or dean; refusal to eat; wandering from established program areas; sexual activity; possession or use of cell phones; or possession of weapons. Any camper sent home will be reaccepted for an Outdoor Ministries event only after consultation with the Outdoor Ministries Committee and the Director of Outdoor Ministries.

<u>Health Form Requirements</u>: CHANGE IN POLICY *Health forms are to be mailed to camp* (not Yarmouth) at least two weeks prior to camp. Health forms are available on-line, or will be mailed by request. Parents fill out the first three pages, including vaccination records. A doctor's signature is needed on the fourth page requiring a physical examination by a licensed physician within the last two years. A physical form signed by a doctor within the last two years that clears the camper for school sports or other activities may be substituted for page four. If a camper has a health form on file at Pilgrim Lodge, signed by a doctor in 2006, parents may check and re-sign last year's form upon arrival. Please call 207-724-3200 if you are not sure if your child's health form is still valid.

<u>Medications</u>: All medications (including non-prescription medicines) must be turned over to the camp nurse or designated trip leader at registration. Do not bring common over the counter medications such as Tylenol - they are available from the camp nurse. Medications should be clearly marked with the camper's name, the name of the medication, and usage instructions. Unused medications are to be picked up at the end of the week. We recommend you speak with your doctor about your child remaining on medications prescribed during the school year while at camp.

Disclosure of Medical Conditions: In order for us to help your child have the best experience possible, the Camp Director needs to be aware in advance of any physical, emotional or behavioral needs a child may have. Special arrangements can be made. This information is shared only with those responsible for the care of your child.

Screening: A camp nurse will train staff members to perform a brief health screening upon arrival. This includes recording of the camper's temperature, questions, and a check for evidence of head lice.

Health Care: A nurse is on duty during all youth camps, with standing orders from a doctor on call. We will attempt to reach parents if an illness or injury requires a visit to our on-call doctor's office or the emergency room. If we cannot reach parents, we will bring the camper for treatment and continue to try to reach parents. Parents or guardians are responsible for health care costs should a camper need to be brought to our on-call doctor's office, pharmacy, or the emergency room. Invoices for such visits will be given to parents when they pick up their camper. Parents are responsible for payment directly to the health care provider. At the time the camper is picked up, parents will reimburse the Maine Conference for prescription medication purchased on a camper's behalf.

Insect Repellent and Sunscreen: Lyme Disease and other insect-borne illnesses are a risk in any outdoor activity in the state of Maine. Campers need to bring and apply appropriate, non-aerosol insect repellent. Exposure to the sun also carries risk. Campers need to bring and apply sunscreen with an SPF factor of at least 15 before outdoor activities.

Open Registration: Rules concerning acceptance and participation in all Maine Conference Outdoor Ministries events are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, sexual orientation, gender, or national origin.

Smoking: Events sponsored by the Outdoor Ministries Committee are smoke-free.

<u>Alcohol and Drugs</u>: Alcohol and other drugs are not permitted at Pilgrim Lodge or Outdoor Ministries events. Drugs include inhalants such as gas or glue and the misuse of over the counter or prescription medicine. Anyone using or possessing alcohol or illegal drugs will be sent home immediately and the camper's minister will be notified. All prescription & nonprescription drugs must be given to the nurse at registration.

<u>Fireworks</u>: Fireworks are not permitted at Pilgrim Lodge or at Outdoor Ministries sponsored events. Anyone using or possessing fireworks will be sent home immediately and their minister will be notified.

Scholarships: Scholarships are available from the Maine Conference United Church of Christ for members of Maine Conference churches. Application for scholarships can be found in this brochure or on-line. In addition, many local churches have their own camp scholarship program. Please ask your pastor if such a program is available in your church.

Publicity: Photographs taken of campers may be used for promotion by the Maine Conference, including, but not limited to: future camp brochures, promotional slide shows and video presentations, and the Pilgrim Lodge website. Children's names are not listed on the website with their photos.

Drop Off and Pick Up: Unless you read differently in a dean's letter, campers should arrive on Sunday, the first day of camp, no earlier than 2:00 PM. Registration is from 2:00-4:00 PM. Campers should be picked up Saturday between 9:30 and 10:30 in the morning. Closing programs may be planned so check your dean's letter!

Visitation: Parents, family members and friends of campers are cordially invited to visit during registration and departure only. At other times campers will be fully occupied and family and friends are asked to please refrain from visiting or calling campers by telephone.

U.S. Mail to campers: Letters from home are encouraged. Please keep letters upbeat and do not focus on how much you miss your camper. **Do not mail candy or food.** Do not send any mail after Thursday's pickup. Address letters this way:

E-mailing campers: One email per day please. Do not send email prior to camper's arrival. Do not send attached files, or on-line cards; they will be discarded. Campers will receive a print out of your email but will not have access to electronic reply.

Subject line: To [camper's full name], cabin # [camper's cabin number] Send to: "camper@pilgrimlodge.org" Don't write your camper's proper name, just the word "camper."

Faxing campers: One fax per day please. Do not send fax's prior to camper's arrival. Campers will receive a printed copy of your fax, but will not have access to electronic reply. No cover page needed. At the top of fax write:

To [camper's full name], cabin #[cabin number]. Send to 207-724-3732.

Camp Store, **Mission**, **and Store Accounts:** The camp store sells postcards and stamps, Pilgrim Lodge T-shirts, hats, and flashlights, memorabilia, and necessary items such as toothbrushes, and film. All proceeds from the Pilgrim Lodge store go directly to support the ministry of Pilgrim Lodge. Clothing purchased at the camp store is certified sweat-shop and child labor free. No cash is accepted at the store during the week. Parents set up camper store accounts on arrival that is drawn down during the week. On Saturday you will receive any change due. During the week the store will open once a day for ice-cream sales (75 cents per cone) and once a day for other items. During the week campers will be presented with information on the camp's mission project (see page 14). Campers will be invited to make an offering to the project from their store accounts.

Pre-camp Visits Parents concerned that their child is nervous or may become homesick can do some things to help the child prepare for camp. A visit to camp ahead of time is the best way for a child to know what to expect. Please call before you visit. Coming to camp with a friend is another good idea (although we do not house friends in the same cabin).

Campers staying in the same cabin with friends from home: We do not house friends from the same church together, nor do we grant requests for campers to be together. Our experience is that friends from home tend to relate to one another instead of getting to know new cabin mates. We hope campers will make new friends in their cabin. Cabin time is limited and there is ample time for friends to be together during camp.

Group Photos: Every camper will receive an 8X10 photo of all the people in their camp. CD-Roms of digital photos from your campers week can be purchased at the camp store. If you pre-order a CD on arrival, you will save the cost of postage.

Phone Calls: Phones are available for use by campers only in case of emergency. The office phone number is 207-724-3200. If the office is closed IN THE EVENT OF EMERGENCY ONLY you may call 207-724-3300.

Counselorships: In appreciation of parents volunteering to be counselors, a **\$75** credit will be granted toward their child's camp fee for each week a parent is a counselor. Counselorships may be applied to any 2007 Pilgrim Lodge program, but for immediate family only. Counselorships must be applied during the summer in which the parent serves as a counselor. Counselorships are not to be used for registration deposits.

Arriving Late, Early, or Leaving Camp for Appointments: In order to create a camp community, we need the full participation of all campers. Please schedule all routine appointments and activities accordingly. Please select a camp week that does not conflict. Any departures are for family emergencies only.

2007 Pilgrim Lodge Registration

What's with that big second page on the registration form?

The *application for free and reduced school meals* is new. Money received will go directly into our food operations budget to help keep the cost of camp down. Our neighbors at Camp Mechuwana started this program ten years ago as an experiment; since then they have received more than \$85,200.

The forms are confidential and the information will only be used to determine eligibility. No one at camp will know who is eligible and who is not. It is important that everyone complete this form, even if you are sure you do not qualify. Standards set for summer camps are lower than public schools so many who do not qualify at school will qualify here. Thank you for taking the time to complete this form.

Registration Deposit: \$75 per camper per event (unless stated otherwise in the event description) applied toward the full fee. A deposit must accompany each registration. **See page 5 "Payment and Refunds" for information on payment.** Fully completed registration forms are accepted in the order in which they are received. Registration forms not signed by parents and campers will be returned, the camper will not be eligible for registration until the signed form is returned to the Yarmouth office. Send completed registration forms and a deposit check to the above address. **Checks should be made payable to "Maine Conference UCC."**

Campers entering grade 4-9 may register for only one Pilgrim Lodge camp until June 1. Grades 10-12 may register for more than one event. After June 1, campers entering grades 4-9 may register for a second event. Campers may also register for a family camp and/or other specialty camp in addition to their Pilgrim Lodge camp before June 1.

All events are subject to cancellation due to insufficient registration. If an event is cancelled, full refund of payments (including registration deposit) will be made. Confirmation notices will be sent after a registration is received and accepted.

Scholarships

No child should be denied the PL camping experience due to lack of funds.

THERE VERY WELL MAY BE ADDITIONAL FUNDS AVAILABLE FROM YOUR LOCAL CHURCH. SPEAK WITH YOUR PASTOR ABOUT HOW TO APPLY FOR LOCAL CHURCH FUNDS. This application is only for scholarship funds directly from the Maine Conference.

Pilgrim Lodge prices are already lower than most summer camps because the program is subsidized by volunteer help and donations from churches and individuals. We have a limited amount of funds to help those truly in need. These funds are set aside to provide financial assistance to those campers whose families need additional help to pay camp registration fees. The funds come primarily from special donations made by churches, groups and individuals. We must rely on your judgment as to the determination of the need for additional scholarship support for a particular camper. This is NOT a general, all-purpose scholarship fund available to all campers merely for the asking. Please apply only if your child will not be able to attend at the full price. Scholarships will be granted based on the number of applications received. All applications are due by May 18, 2007. Applications received following that date will be considered if any funds remain after all on-time applications have been processed. Applications for scholarships must be signed by a Maine Conference United Church of Christ pastor. Often a scholarship fund is granted in the amount of one third of the camper registration fee. We ask parents or guardians to provide one third and the local church to provide one third. We also request that other sources of financial assistance be sought.

A word from Bryan, the Camp Director

At Pilgrim Lodge we continually look for ways to make the camping experience even more meaningful as well as to improve our health and safety procedures. After many years of success it's time to take the next logical step. Throughout 2007, the Outdoor Ministries Committee; members of the Pilgrim Lodge and Maine Conference Staffs and a huse parade of volunteers will be working with the American Camp Association (ACA) to ready PL for accreditation. ACA sets the bar for best practices in the camping industry. What will accreditation mean for Pilgrim Lodge? It means we will be following 208 ACA standards for a healthy and safe camp. The good news is that we already follow most of them, although accreditation will require specific documentation to demonstrate that fact. This is a good year to take on this task, as the State of Maine is revamping their regulations for camps, based largely on the ACA standards. Parents can rest assured that PL is up to code as well as up to ACA requirements. There will be a few changes, for example installing carbon monoxide detectors in all sleeping quarters. The cost of such changes and the cost of joining ACA account for the larger than usual bump in prices this year. Joining ACA will not mean losing any of the unique and wonderful qualities we love about PL in favor of a cookie-cutter approach to camping. The Association values and honors the diversity of camping experiences. This is a massive project. If you'd like to help, give me a call. From the *Maine Turnpike* (*Interstate -95*) take exit 102, turn RIGHT onto *Route 126*. Skip the next line.

From *I-295* take exit 51, turn Left on *Route 126*.
