- -finding God in my fellow human beings (age 17)
- -feeling like I could be myself, and it was OK (age 15)
- -new friends, and talking to God (age 13)
- -being asked what I thought about the Bible instead of just being told (age 10)
- -I couldn't tell the best part because I loved it all! (age 12)
- -reconnecting to something precious inside that I thought I'd lost, by taking time to reflect, by the deep sense of love that pervades everything at PL, and by the sheer beauty of the place (adult camper)

This is such an exciting and historic time at Pilgrim Lodge! With the success of the Capital Campaign (\$1.94 million as of this writing!) Pilgrim Lodge's future is vibrant and optimistic.
