



Accommodation Details:

- You can stay for ten dollars per night.
- · You may register for all or part of the weekend.
- Reservations are necessary for overnight stays. Fill out the registration form at www.pilgrimlodge.org/50thanniversary.html
- You may choose to stay in a co-ed, or gender specific cabin and you may choose a family or adult only cabin.
- You also may request to stay as a group (although we do not guarantee exclusivity of any particular group).
- No particular bed can be reserved. Cabins will be assigned and beds are chosen on a first come first serve basis, so if you want to sleep on a porch, get there early.
- Bring a warm sleeping bag or blankets.
- Meals offered: Saturday meals, and Sunday Breakfast. When you register you will pick which meals you want.
- If you do plan to leave during the celebration on Saturday for any reason, we ask you to move your car to the off-site parking set up for that day to eliminate road traffic. If you are staying the weekend and not leaving Saturday you can park in camp for the duration.
- Meal prices are on the registration form.
- Those under 18 must be accompanied by parents.
- On Sunday morning we will worship and celebrate communion in the chapel.
- Other than worship on Sunday there is no special program planned for Friday or Sunday other than relaxing with your friends

Scholarships]



Pilgrim Lodge prices are already lower than most summer camps because the program is subsidized by volunteer help and donations from churches and individuals. We have a limited amount of funds to help those truly in need. These funds are set aside to provide financial assistance to those campers whose families need additional help to pay camp registration fees. The funds come primarily from special donations made by churches, groups and individuals. We must rely on your judgment as to the determination of the need for additional scholarship support for a particular camper. This is NOT a general, all-purpose scholarship fund available to all campers merely for the asking. Please apply only if your child will not be able to attend at the full price. Scholarships will be granted based on the number of applications received. All applications are due by May 19, 2006. Applications received following that date will be considered if any funds remain after all on-time applications have been processed. Applications for scholarships must be signed by a Maine Conference United Church of Christ pastor. Often a scholarship fund is granted in the amount of one third of the camper registration fee. We ask parents or guardians to provide one third and the local church to provide one third. We also request that other sources of financial assistance be sought.

This year we are asking all parents to set up camper store accounts instead of sending campers with cash. On the day you arrive the

store will be open for you to set up your account. You pay and establish a credit that is drawn down during the week. On Saturday you will receive a report of your store activity and any change due. During the week the store will open once a day for ice-cream sales (75 cents per cone) and once a day for other items. The store sells postcards and stamps, Pilgrim Lodge T-shirts, hats, and flashlights, memorabilia, and necessary items such as toothbrushes, and film. All proceeds from the Pilgrim Lodge store go directly to support the ministry of Pilgrim Lodge.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION THAT PARENTS MUST READ BEFORE SIGNING REGISTRATION FORM

Payment Due: Change in practice A non-refundable deposit of \$75 (or other amount if indicated) is required with initial registration. The balance is due at the conference office two weeks before the start of the event. We will no longer be accepting payment at camp. If payment is not received on time, campers may forfeit their spot to others on the waiting list. See the section on registration on page 14 for more details.

<u>Behavior</u>: Certain behaviors which are deemed inappropriate, (including but not limited to: fighting; hitting; biting; stealing; destruction of, or intrusion into, another's property; threatening another; defying a counselor or dean; refusal to eat; wandering from established program areas; sexual activity; or possession of weapons) can result in a camper being sent home and the camper's minister being notified. Any camper sent home will be reaccepted for an Outdoor Ministries event only after consultation with the Outdoor Ministries Committee and the Director of Outdoor Ministries.

<u>Open Registration</u>: Rules concerning acceptance and participation in all Maine Conference Outdoor Ministries events are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, sexual orientation, gender, or national origin.

Smoking: Events sponsored by the Outdoor Ministries Committee are smoke-free.

<u>Alcohol and Drug</u>: Alcohol and other drugs are not permitted at Outdoor Ministries events. Drugs include inhalants such as gas or glue and the misuse of over the counter or prescription medicine. Anyone using or possessing alcohol or illegal drugs will be sent home immediately and the camper's minister will be notified. All prescription & nonprescription drugs must be given to the nurse at registration.

<u>Fireworks</u>: Fireworks are not permitted at Pilgrim Lodge or at Outdoor Ministries sponsored events. Anyone using or possessing fireworks will be sent home immediately and their minister will be notified.

Health Form Requirements and Medications: Health forms are available on-line or will be mailed by request. A physical examination is required by a licensed physician within the previous two years. Each camper must present a completed and signed health form to the camp nurse upon arrival at camp (unless a health form signed by a doctor in 2005 is on file). There will be no exception. DO NOT send health forms to the Conference Office or to the camp before arrival. All medications (including nonprescription medicines) must be turned over to the camp nurse or designated trip leader at registration. Do not bring common over the counter medications such as Tylenol - they are available from the camp nurse. Medications should be clearly marked with the camper's name, the name of the medication, and usage instructions. Unused medications are to be picked up at the end of the week.

<u>Disclosure of Medical Conditions and Medication:</u> Everyone is differently abled. In order for us to help your child have the best experience possible, the Camp Director and Deans need to be aware in advance of any physical, emotional or behavioral needs a child may have. Special arrangements can be made. This information is shared only with those responsible for the care of your child.

<u>Health Care Expenses:</u> Parents or guardians are responsible for health care costs should a camper need to be brought to our on-call doctor's office, pharmacy or the emergency room. We will attempt to reach parents before such a trip. Invoices for such visits will be given to parents when they pick up their camper. Parents are responsible for payment directly to the health care provider. At the time the camper is picked up, parents will reimburse the Maine Conference for prescription medication purchased on a camper's behalf.

<u>Scholarships</u>: Scholarships are available from the Maine Conference. Application for scholarships can be found in this brochure or on-line. Many local churches also have their own camp scholarship program. Please ask your local pastor if such a program is available in your church.

<u>Counselorships</u>: In appreciation of parents volunteering to be counselors, a \$50 credit will be granted toward their child's camp fee for each week a parent is a counselor. Counselorships may be applied to any week of the summer but for immediate family only. Counselorships must be applied during the summer in which the parent serves as a counselor.

<u>Publicity:</u> Any photos taken of campers may be used for promotion by Pilgrim Lodge, including but not limited to: future camp brochures, promotional slide shows and video presentations, and the Pilgrim Lodge website. Children's names are not listed with their photos.

Frequently Asked Questions

When should campers be dropped off and picked up?

Unless you read differently in a dean's letter, campers should arrive on Sunday, the first day of camp, no earlier than 2:00 PM. Registration is from 2:00-4:00 PM. Campers should be picked up Saturday between 9:30 and 11:00 in the morning. Closing programs may be planned so check your dean's letter!

May we visit our camper during the week?

Parents, family members and friends of campers are cordially invited to visit during registration and departure only. At other times campers will be fully occupied and friends are asked to please refrain from visiting or calling by telephone.

Should we send mail? YES! Camper's love to receive mail! Information on how to send mail is on page 11.

Is there a camp store?

Yes. Please see page 11 to read about the store and required camper store accounts.

How much money should campers bring?

Campers will set up store accounts so cash is necessary only for a mission offering for Back Bay Mission (page 16).

What if campers get homesick?

Very few campers need to go home. Usually extra attention from the counselor and cheerful letters from home are all it takes to help an uneasy child. Parents concerned that their child may become homesick can do some things to help the child prepare for camp. A visit to camp ahead of time is the best way for a child to know what to expect. Please call before you visit. Coming to camp with a friend is another good idea (although we do not house friends in the same cabin).

Can campers stay in the same cabin with friends from home?

No. This is a common request. We do not house friends from the same church together, nor do we grant requests for campers to be together. Our experience is that friends from home tend to relate together instead of getting to know new cabin mates. We hope you will make new friends in your cabin. Cabin time is limited and there is ample time for friends to be together during camp.

What about camp photos?

Every camper will receive an 8X10 photo of all the people in their camp. Many more are available on CD (page 11.)

What should we bring?

Pay attention to your dean's letter for specific items they request, but here is a list to get you started: Your receipt for your camp fee; your health form signed by a physician (don't mail it to camp!); Clothes in which to relax; warm clothes for cold days and nights; rain gear; shorts; jeans; sweatshirts; a Bible; a notebook and pen; bathing suit; beach towel; beach footwear; musical instruments; mission offerings (in a separate envelope); a nice outfit for a special event or celebration (not too formal); bathroom articles (towels, washcloth, soap, toothbrush, comb, brush etc.) in an easy to carry bag or bucket, sleeping bag or bedding for a single bed; pillow; comfy sneakers for outside activities; stationery; flashlight; laundry bag; insect repellant (NON aerosol please!); If you bring CD's for a dance be sure your name is on them! It's a good idea to write your name on everything.

What should we NOT bring?

Candy; gum; food; personal listening devices; electronic handheld games; pets; pocket knives; valuables; jewelry; cell phones; beepers; or computers. And of course, weapons, fireworks; alcohol or illegal drugs.

<u>May campers call home?</u> Phones are available for use by campers only in case of emergency. The office phone number is 207-724-3200. If the office is closed IN THE EVENT OF EMERGENCY ONLY you may call 207-724-3300.




Registration Deposit: \$75 per camper per event (unless stated otherwise in the event description) applied toward the full fee. A deposit must accompany each registration. If a camper withdraws or fails to attend, this deposit will be forfeited, while any additional payments that have been made will be refunded. There is no refund for campers sent home for illness, injury or discipline. Fully completed registration forms are accepted in the order in which they are received. Registration forms not signed by parents will be returned. Send completed registration forms and deposit check to the above address. Checks should be made payable to "Maine Conference UCC."

Campers entering grades 4-9 may register for only one Pilgrim Lodge camp until June 1. Grades 10-12 may register for more than one event. After June 1, campers entering grades 4-9 may register for a second event. Campers may also register for a family camp and/or other specialty camp in addition to their Pilgrim Lodge camp before June 1.

All events are subject to cancellation due to insufficient registration. If an event is cancelled, full refund of payments (including registration deposit) will be made. Confirmation notices will be sent after a registration is received and accepted.

Traveling North:

From the *Maine Turnpike* (*Interstate -95*) take exit 102, turn Right onto *Route 126*

OR From I-295 take exit 51, turn Left on Route 126.

Follow *Route 126* about 2.5 miles./ turn RIGHT onto *Spears Corner Road* at the blinking light)/Continue straight for 4.3 miles, (through 2 stop signs) to a third stop sign. **careful: cross traffic does NOT stop at any of the three stop signs**/At that third stop sign turn Left onto *Neck Road*/Pilgrim Lodge will be one mile ahead on your Right.


Traveling South

Gulf Coast Hurricane Relief at Back Bay Mission

It was clear we wanted to help with the Gulf Coast hurricane relief effort, but how? The Outdoor Ministries committee decided to focus on the United Church of Christ's Back Bay Mission hit hard by Hurricane Katrina. Back Bay Mission was founded in 1922 as an outreach effort of the First Evangelical Church of Biloxi (later United Church of Christ), whose members responded with compassion and service to the needs of poor "fisher folk" living in deplorable conditions along the Back Bay of Biloxi, Mississippi. Since then, Back Bay Mission has continually grown its services and ministries, always keeping the impoverished and marginalized at the center of its concern. Although there were no longer any UCC congregations in Biloxi or in the state of Mississippi by the early 1970s, Back Bay Mission remained to offer a witness of the United Church of Christ. Its commitment is to be faithfully responsive to the emerging and critical needs of God's people, ever seeking a day of greater justice and peace.





The small staff of six full time and four part time persons provide direct services to poor families

while creating new independent service agencies. Services are delivered annually to South Mississippians in such diverse areas as education, legal aid, health care, feeding programs, early childhood development, family counseling, housing, and domestic violence. We'll be taking an offering to help the recovery effort and learn more about this historic and vital UCC mission.


