
### It's important to remember





Now more than ever PL needs volunteers to make camp possible. In the front of this brochure is a statement about PL being "your church's summer camp." We need people to help open and close the camp as well as help with special projects and ongoing maintenance. Your goodwill and elbow grease will have lasting and real results that will help children, youth and adults experience the holy and grow in faith. Jump Start is always on the last Saturday of April and the day before. Fall Work day is always on the last Saturday of October. We welcome youth groups and children from sixth grade and older. We ask you to leave younger children at home for safety and insurance reasons. At both events children in 6th through 8th grade need to have an adult with them who can supervise them, and older youth need an adult ratio of one to five. Children need permission slips and health forms available online or by phone. Friday at Jump Start is sparsely attended but gets us set up and going. No meals are served on Friday because the kitchen isn't ready. If you would like to stay over on Friday night please call in advance. We'll have Saturday breakfast ready if you stay over, and Saturday lunch is free for everyone. New this year, youth groups who work can stay over Saturday night for free to attend the youth group overnight (see next page). Groups need adults with them. If you're coming in the fall to help close camp bring a bag lunch, we're scrubbing and closing the kitchen. 
