This is a brand-new camp weekend designed with you in mind. Whether you're a long-time PL camper or new to camp, we're aiming to create space for reflection, fun, and growth. As your deans, we are passionate about cultivating spaces for spiritual question-asking, growing and engaging. This weekend we have plans to learn about ways to give back, plans for reflection and meditation, walking on a spiritual journey together, and learning about our own agency to be leaders in our world and even the wider Church. In addition to all this, this year's mission project for PL's adult camps is the UCC Disaster Ministries work with Puerto Rico. September 2017's Hurricane Maria was the worst natural disaster on record to hit Puerto Rico. UCC Disaster Ministries is working hand in hand with the Iglesia Evangélica Unida de Puerto Rico to meet partners' requests for generators and other necessities, give preparedness workshops, funds for tuition assistance and pastoral support, and provide fieldwork teams to restore homes. A group of Maine Conference folks volunteered as a fieldwork team in 2018 and will be leading the mission presentation. To support these efforts in Puerto Rico, we will be taking a mission offering during camp. Campers are encouraged to bring an offering (donation) to help support the important work the UCC Disaster Ministries and the Iglesia Evangelica Unida de Puerto Rico are doing.
